Afterschool wraparound provision.

Thank you to all of you who have completed the short consultation regarding Lamesley childcare. The soft opening from 8.45am means that children have until 9am to arrive at school thus easing congestion outside. If you are running late, please do not 'stop and drop' as this is jeopardising the safety of our children and obviously causing concern for parents and staff in school.
