<b>Big Question: Why do we need memories?</b>

<p><b>4. How is the Eucharist a memorial?</b> Pupils will know and understand how the Eucharist is a memorial.</p>	Children will show understanding of, by making links between beliefs and sources
<p><b>5. Why is the Eucharist called 'the mystery of faith'?</b> The Eucharist is a sacrifice.</p>	Children will show a knowledge and understanding of religious symbols and the steps involved in religious actions and worship, including the celebration of the Sacraments
<p><b>6. What are the symbols and steps during the consecration?</b> Remembering, celebrating and responding to waiting hopefully in life and that Advent is the church's season of waiting in joyful hope for the coming of Jesus, the promised one, at Christmas and at the end of time.</p>	Children will show understanding of what it means to belong to a church community
<p><b>7. Why is sacrifice important in our lives?</b> Sacrifice in daily life.</p>	Children will show understanding of, by making links between beliefs & life

<b>Memorial</b>	Intended to commemorate someone or something
<b>genuflect</b>	To lower one's body briefly by bending one knee to the ground, typically in worship or as a sign of respect
<b>consecration</b>	the action of declaring bread and wine to be or represent the body and blood of Christ.
adoration	Deep love and respect.
