Big Question: What is friendship and unity?

Line of enquiry/ Learning outcome	Standard Indicators
<p>1. Why are we happiest when we are united?</p> <p>Pupils will know and understand what nourishes and what spoils friendship and unity.</p>	Some children will be able to make links to show how feelings and beliefs about what makes and breaks friendship and unity affects their behaviour and that of others.
<p>2. As Christians, how do we unite together?</p> <p>Jesus' prayer and unity</p>	Some children will be able to show understanding of the links between a range of Scripture texts and some parts of the Mass which express communion with Jesus and the feelings that communion with others brings.
<p>3. As Christians, how are we in communion with Jesus?</p> <p>In communion with Jesus</p>	Some children will be able to use religious terms to show an understanding of different aspects of the Eucharist.
<p>4. How does the Eucharistic prayer guide Christians to live in unity?</p> <p>The Eucharist challenges Christians to live in communion.</p>	Some children will be able to show understanding of how belief in Jesus Christ, the uniting presence in Holy Communion, shapes the lives of Christians.
<p>5. How does the 'Our Father' shape the life of Christians?</p> <p>The Our Father</p>	<p>To use sources to express a point of view.</p> <p>Show a knowledge and understanding of those actions of believers which arise as a consequence of their beliefs.</p>
<p>6. How do Christians share peace with others in their community?</p> <p>Prayer for peace and unity and sign of peace.</p>	Some children will be able to show an understanding of how own and other's decisions are informed by beliefs and moral values.

Key Vocabulary

Word	Definition
Unity	Being joined together as one in faith and love.
Communion	A connection with God that is made through the receiving of the Eucharist.
Community	A group of people who care for each other, like those who belong to the family of God and the church.
Unity of the faithful	All believers in Jesus being united as once family in the church and the eyes of God.
