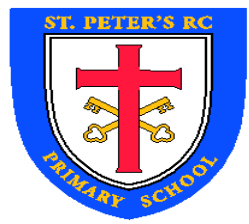
Reading at home

Each day your child will bring home their chosen Accelerated reader book and their corresponding reading record.

*We ask that children read for at least **15 minutes per evening** and that they should be listened to at least **3 times per week**.*

We ask that when you hear your child read, that you sign their Reading record.

Children will need to bring both books into school each day, so that they can read it in their school reading sessions.

Accelerated reader Taking the quiz



Once your child has finished reading a book, it's time for them to take their AR quiz. Students should take quizzes within 24 hours of finishing a book. If they must wait longer and they do poorly, teachers will not know if the students had problems comprehending what they read, or if they simply forgot some of the details.

Passing the quiz is an indication that your child understood what has been read.

Each child has their own log-in details for accessing Accelerated Reader.

If your child completes a book when they are at home, they can take a test by using our School Accelerated Reader link.

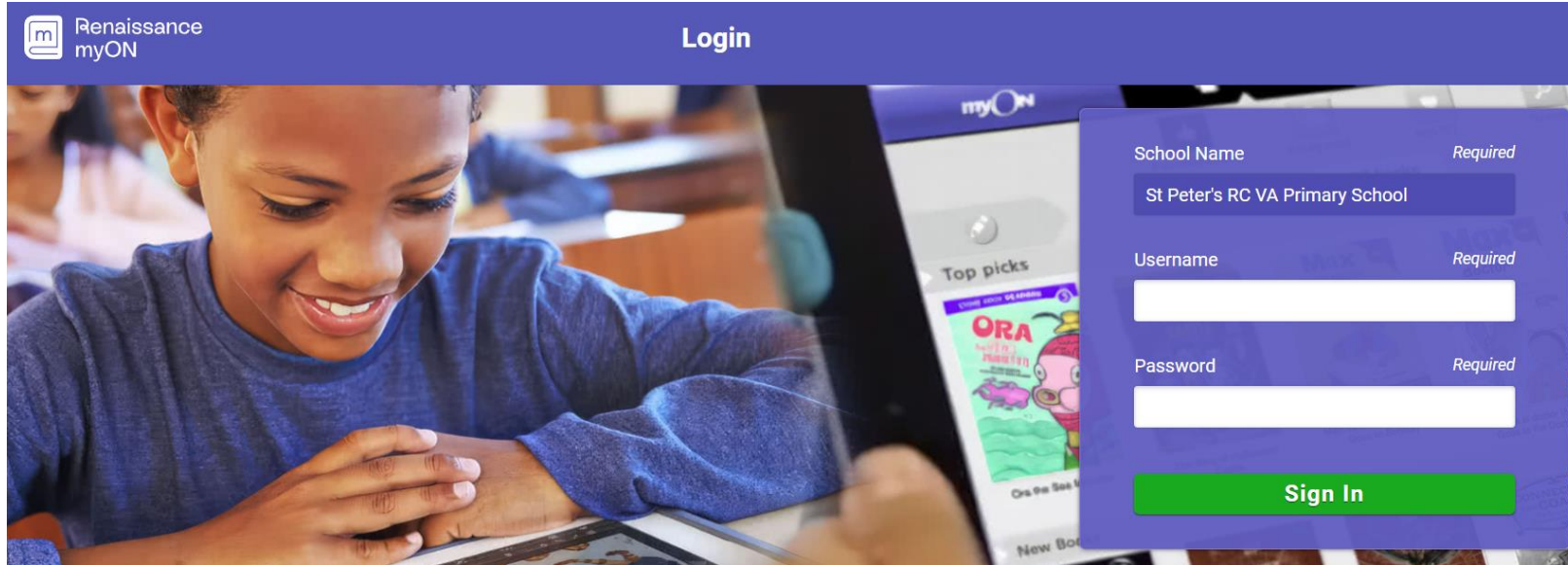
Your child will already know their log in details and if they don't please contact their class teacher.
